Course Topic

National Dialogues have become an increasingly important topic in international debates. They are seen as a promising approach to addressing and resolving the causes of violent political conflicts in an inclusive manner. National Dialogues can be set up before, during or after peace negotiations and serve to provide a space to discuss issues and build trust among different segments of the population. Being nationally-led, such processes are crucial in promoting ownership, inclusivity and legitimacy.

Responding to this increased interest in the topic, this 10-day on-site course with online assignments provides:

- Insights on how to understand, design and support National Dialogue processes
- Training in dialogue and mediation skills
- Reflection on lessons that can be drawn from previous cases

Course methodologies include expert inputs, peer exchange, skills training, case studies, simulation exercises and reflection.

The course is designed for practitioners and academics interested in bridging their own experiences with current academic insights and practical knowledge on National Dialogues.
